Welcome

We are happy to present to you the first NAIA Hoops Report Preseason Magazine. Our hope, with this entire issue, is to help paint the picture of the landscape of NAIA basketball and to help provide positive excitement about this level of play. This is a project we have wanted to do for the past few years and finally put the MASSIVE work into it that it takes to pull off a magazine! Recapping last season, we saw Loyola -New Orleans, take home a National Title. They arguably had the Top two players in the NAIA in Zach Wrightsil and Myles Burns. Both of which have decided to use their 5th year of eligibility at NCAA D1 programs. We see NAIA players leave to D1 nearly every season, but this year may be the most we have ever seen. Wrightsil will take his talents to Marquette, Burns heads off to Ole Miss. Their Loyola teammate, Brandon Davis is transferring to Texas State. Also headed to play D1 basketball are All-Americans, Jaylon Scott (Bethel (KS) to Charleston), Alex Gross (Olivet Nazarene to Morehead State) and Jonathan Brown (Central Methodist to Montana). Most of those transfers are grad transfers who decided to move on to D1 for final year of eligibility. BUT, that just goes to show what talent is in the NAIA every year!


While some players chose to use their 5th year to transfer up to D1, heading into this season we still see quite a few impact players using that 5th year of eligibility that was granted to them to remain with their NAIA programs. Highlighting that list are two 1st team All-Americans in Seth Maxwell of Indiana Wesleyan and Matt Simpson of Florida College. Those two also make up just two of the 12 players who return from the 30 member All-American teams last season.

With the small group of impact players returning, it will be interesting to see if some of the prominent NAIA powerhouse teams are able to repeat their dominance within their own leagues. We saw some teams last season take some big steps forward and are now hungry to fight for league titles. We will get to see if we see some "changing of the guard" a bit around the NAIA. Especially with the Top 25 ranking system moving from conference raters to now having the ARC raters rank the Top 25 teams. It will be interesting to see what impact that has on the polls this season!

No matter how this season turns out, you know it will be another great year in the NAIA! We are excited to be alongside of you the entire way! ARIZONA CHRISTIAN

Hard to not love this Firestorm squad heading into this season. A squad that went 31-5 and lost in the Fab Four last season returns elite guard play in Angelo Johnson (2nd Team All-American) and Dennis Flowers, who was the team's 2nd leading scorer last year. They also return shooter, Paul Hayden who is 41% from 3 in his career and KeyVaughn Williams, who has 105 wins in his career at ACU. The Firestorm also return starting Forward, Bryce Davis, who was part of the NAIA All-Tournament team last season. The Firestorm will add newcomers Trent Hudgens, a D1 transfer from Santa Clara who was also a Top 5 prep player in Arizona out of High School, Mikah Blackwell, a 1st Team All-State California JUCO selection after averaging 18pts/10rebs per game, sharp shooting, James Berry, from D1 Merrimack and Ethan Blythe (Lane CC), DPOY in the NWACC. This is already a loaded group who is also expecting big things from 6'9 Freshman, Rick Maganga, who comes to ACU out of Gabon, Africa. When you are looking at teams who can compete for a National Title, ACU has the talent, the coaching, the guard play, the size and the depth to win it all. Can they piece it all together? We shall see, but they deserve the top spot in the rankings and will enter the season as the favorites to bring home a NAIA National Title.



WILLIAM JESSUP



Could we see back-to-back seasons with two teams from the same league meeting in the national title game? Jessup returns their top two scorers in GSAC POY, Cash Williams (1st Team All-American) and Myles Corey (HM AA). They also return starter, Jaylen Johnson and part time starters Charlie Garison and Jordan Adams. They bring in a pair of NAIA transfers, Xavier Lovelace (Eastern Oregon) who is a perfect fit for how the Warriors play and Nigel McKay (Warner Pacific) big time shooter. They also bring in Max Edwards (La Pierce College) who averaged 18ppg in 2020 to gain All-State Cali JUCO honors. Jahvy Medearis (D1 Cal State-Bakersfield) and Aashay Verma (Butte College). This is a Warrior team that is built for another deep run after falling to Arizona Christian in the NAIA Quarterfinals last season.

COLLEGE OF IDAHO

College of Idaho is the only men's program in the country, at any level, that has won 30+ games in each of the past four regular seasons (minus the covid year). The Yotes went 32-5 last season, won the Cascade Collegiate Conference and made it all the way to the NAIA Quarterfinals, before falling to the National Champions, Loyola. The Yotes return Drew Wyman and Jake O'Neil, two Sophomores that had big time Freshman years and are going to be a lot of fun to watch over the next three seasons. 3rd overall may be a little aggressive to start the season, but the Yotes are going to be really, really good!



INDIANA WESLEYAN

Headed past two to win to more un season favorite this is a

Headed into Year Three as one division in the NAIA and the Wildcats have spent the better part of the past two seasons inside the Top 5. They bring back Seth Maxwell, who will be an early season favorite to win the NAIA National Player of the Year. They also return Spencer Piercefield who is one of the more underrated guards in the country. IWU is coming off of a 16-2 record in the Crossroads last season and even though they are losing some key contributors they should be the early season favorites to win the league once again! They have a really fun and strong non-conference schedule, so this is a team we are going to find out a lot about early on the in the season!

GRACE

For us, we thought this would be the year that Grace would make their big jump. They had other ideas though and made that jump last season. The young Lancer squad made it all the way to Kansas City before losing in the NAIA Round of 16. They return everyone from that squad and feature two NAIA POY candidates in Frankie Davidson and Elijah Malone. The experience this team got last year will only help them this season as they prep for a deeper run this year. The Crossroads League is always brutal and Indiana Wesleyan, will still be the team to beat. The Lancers are no longer young though and have been battle tested. The biggest question for them this year is how they handle going from an "up and coming" team, to one with big time expectations! If they can handle that, this is a team that can compete with anyone!





OKLAHOMA WESLEYAN

OKWU comes into the season, fresh off of a 34-3 season that took them all the way to the NAIA Quarterfinals. The Eagles are a deep squad, that has played basically a 5 in - 5 out system the past few years. They are anchored by 3rd Team All-American, Jaiden Letzke, who is back and could be the early favorite to win the KCAC Player of the Year. Head Coach, Donnie Bostwick, will have the Eagles ready to make another deep run this season!

FAULKNER

The SSAC was the best league in the NAIA last season, as proven by having both Loyola and Talladega in the National Championship game. With both of those squads losing head coaches and a plethora of good talent, the Eagles look to be soaring into the top spot this year. They are led by SSAC Freshman of the Year and 3rd team All-American, CJ Hines and also return 1st team All-SSAC member, Trace Hill. They have lost two years in a row now in the Round of 16, but once again look like a team primed to make a run to Kansas City!



JAMESTOWN

A new year is upon us and here we are again, with Jamestown inside of our Preseason Top 10. As they should be, with Mason Wlaters (2x All-American) back in the fold. He is a contender for National Player of the Year and leads a veteran Jimmie group that despite some major hiccups in the regular season, over the past two seasons, has played their best basketball at the end of each season. They have now made back-to-back trips to Kansas City and are looking good to make it 3 straight!

GEORGETOWN


We had gone back and forth with Georgetown and Thomas More here, but we eventually settled in with Georgetown taking the final spot in the Top 10. They return 3 starters from last year and you can add in a fourth returning starter if you count the return of Jake Ohmer, who led Georgetown in scoring back in 2020, when the Tigers were the #1 ranked team in the NAIA before the Covid-shortened season. The Tigers got upset in the NAIA opening round last season, but Coach Briggs has the Tigers looking like a contender again!



THOMAS MORE

Thomas More is set to leave the NAIA after this season and they would love nothing more than to leave it with a Red Banner! They are coming off of a Fab Four run last season and return Reid Jolly (1st Team ALL-MSC), Noah Pack (HM All-MSC), Jacob Jones, Casey George and Wyatt Vieth from that team. Justin Ray and staff will also turn to 4 incoming transfers to help the Saints compete for a National Title this season. This is a dangerous Thomas More team, who plays well together on both sides of the ball. If the new guys buy-in right away, and gels together, the Saints can be a National Title contender!

FOR US, WE FEEL IT IS IMPORTANT TO HIGHLIGHT THE CAREERS OF SOME OF THE MOST PROMINANT PLAYERS TO EVER PLAY AT THIS LEVEL. ONE OF THE MORE RECENT, OF THOSE PROMINANT PLAYERS, IS THE JOURNEY OF 2020 NAIA PLAYER OF THE YEAR, CHRIS COFFEY. WHOSE JOURNEY TOOK HIM FROM A HIGH SCHOOL KID WHO WAS THINKING OF BECOMING A MARINE, TO ONE OF THE FIERECEST COMPETITORS THE NAIA HAS SEEN OVER THE PAST DECADE!

HEADING INTO HIS SENIOR YEAR IN HIGH SCHOOL, CHRIS DIDN'T HAVE MANY OFFERS TO PLAY COLLEGE BASKETBALL. WITH HIS INVOLVEMENT IN THE ROTC, HE THOUGHT HIS FUTURE WAS ONE AS A MARINE. THINGS CHANGED THAT SUMMER THOUGH WHEN GEORGETOWN ASSISTANT, JAMES JACKSON, SAW CHRIS PLAY. COACH JACKSON SAW THE POTENTIAL WITHIN CHRIS AND WENT TO CHRIS'S HOMETOWN OF LOUISVILLE, KY TO SEE HIM AND HIS FAMILY. AFTER THE BASKETBALL SEASON, CHRIS WAS ABLE TO GO ON A VISIT TO GEORGETOWN AND THAT IS WHEN HE KNEW THAT HIS FUTURE WAS AS A COLLEGE BASKETBALL PLAYER AND NOT AS A MARINE. HE FELL IN LOVE WITH THE CAMPUS AND THE TRADITION. HE LOVED HOW MUCH COACH CHRIS BRIGGS AND JACKSON BELIEVED IN HIM AND HE KNEW IT WAS AN EASY DECISION TO JOIN THE TRADITION RICH PROGRAM AND TRY TO LEAVE HIS OWN MARK ON THE PROGRAM!

IN A PROGRAM WITH A HISTORY OF GREAT TEAMS AND PLAYERS, CHRIS COFFEY DID INDEED LEAVE HIS OWN MARK ON THE PROGRAM. DURING HIS TIME AS A TIGER, COFFEY, ALONG WITH FELLOW SENIOR ALL-AMERICANS, ELJAY COWHERD AND JACOB CONWAY, HELPED TO LEAD GEORGETOWN TO THE 2019 NAIA NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP (THE PROGRAMS FIRST SINCE 2013). IN 2020, WHEN COVID CANCELED THE NAIA NATIONAL TOURNAMENT, THE TIGERS WERE THE #1 TEAM IN THE COUNTRY. AT 30-2, THEY MAY HAVE BEEN ON THEIR WAY TO BACK-TO-BACK NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS. COFFEY WAS A BIG PART OF THOSE SQUADS AS HE WAS TWICE NAMED TO THE NAIA ALL-AMERICAN LIST, INCLUDING BEING NAMED THE NAIA PLAYER OF THE YEAR IN 2020. HE WAS NAMED AS THE MOST OUTSTANDING PLAYER IN THE 2019 NATIONAL TOURNAMENT. A CAREER THAT WILL NO DOUBT LEAD TO A FUTURE GEORGETOWN TIGER HALL OF FAME INDUCTION.

HIS NAIA SUCCESS HELPED LAUNCH HIM INTO A PRO CONTRACT. COFFEY SIGNED HIS FIRST PRO CONTRACT IN LATVIA IN 2020. HIS SUCCES AS A PRO HAS OPENED UP OPPORTUNTIES TO WORKOUT FOR NBA TEAMS AND HE EVEN JOINED THE GOLDEN STATE WARRIORS MINI CAMP THIS PAST SPRING. HE IS CURRENTLY IN FRANCE, PLAYING IN THE BETCLIC ELITE LEAGUE WITH ADA BLOIS BASKET 41. WHILE THE NBA IS THE DREAM AND GOAL STILL, CHRIS IS ENJOYING TRAVELING THE WORLD AND LEARNING ABOUT HIMSELF ABOUT WHAT HE WANTS OUT OF LIFE! HE HAS ALSO TAKEN ADVANTAGE OF SHOWCASING HIS TALENTS IN THE BASKETBALL TOURNAMENT (TBT) ON ESPN THE PAST TWO SUMMERS. COFFEY GOT THE INVITE FROM HIS AGENT, DREW KELSO - OMS, ALMA MATTER, TEAM ARKANSAS. THE \$1 MILLION, WINNER TAKE ALL, EVENT HAS ALLOWED CHRIS TO FIND A NEW FAMILY WITH HIS TEAM ARKANSAS GUYS. HE SAID THE TBT IS LIKE A ROLLERCOASTER BECAUSE YOU JUST DON'T EVER KNOW WHAT TO EXPECT. EVERY TEAM IS LOADED WITH TALENT, INCLUDING MANY WHO HAD STINTS IN THE NBA. MAYBE NEXT YEAR THEY CAN FIND A WAY TO WIN IT ALL, BUT FOR NOW, COFFEY ENJOYS HIS TEAMMATES AND GETTING TO PLAY AGAINST SOME OF THE BEST PLAYERS FROM AROUND THE WORLD!

CHRIS COFFEY WOULD HAVE MADE A HECK OF A MARINE, BUT HE IS A BIG BELIEVER THAT EVERYTHING HAPPENS FOR A REASON. EVEN IN THE UPS AND DOWNS OF HIS CAREER, HE UNDERSTANDS THAT AS LONG AS YOU STAY TRUE TO WHO YOU ARE, AND LET GOD LEAD THE WAY, THAT YOUR DREAMS AND GOALS WILL COME TO LIGHT! IT'S SAFE TO SAY THAT NO MATTER WHERE CHRIS COFFEY'S JOURNEY TAKES HIM, HE IS SET UP FOR SUCCESS. WE, SELFISHLY, ARE GLAD HE CHOSE THE NAIA OUT OF HIGH SCHOOL! IT HAS BEEN FUN WATCHING HIM GROW FROM HIS TIME AS A FRESHMAN, TO WHAT HE HAS BECOME AS A PRO. American Midwest Conference Preview

THE AMERICAN MIDWEST CONFERENCE HAS HAD 3 DIFFERENT CHAMPIONS OVER THE PAST 3 SEASONS. DEFENDING CHAMPIONS, MISSOURI BAPTIST LOST THEIR TWO BEST PLAYERS AND WHILE THEY STILL SHOULD COMPETE FOR THE AMC TITLE, WE COULD SEE A NEW TEAM WIN THE AMC FOR THE FOURTH STRAIGHT SEASON. IT TRULY IS A WIDE-OPEN LEAGUE. AS OF RIGHT NOW THOUGH, COLUMBIA (MO) LOOKS LIKE THE TEAM TO BEAT HERE. THEY RETURN THE 2020-21 AMC POY, TONY BURKS, AS WELL AS A GOOD CORE OF OTHER RETURNERS. WHILE THE AMC WILL ENTER THE SEASON WITH FOUR LEGIT TEAMS, WHO SEEM TO BE READY TO COMPETE FOR THE AMC TITLE, DON'T COUNT OUT A FEW SLEEPER TEAMS LIKE LYON AND WILLIAMS BAPTIST. BOTH TEAMS HAVE A COUPLE KEY IMPACT TRANSFERS THAT COULD HELP CATAPULT THEIR TEAMS UP THE AMC STANDINGS THIS YEAR! NATIONALLY. THE AMC HASN'T HAD MUCH SUCCESS IN THE NAIA TOURNEY THE PAST FEW SEASONS. HOWEVER, THIS IS A LEAGUE TO KEEP AN EYE ON EARLY. THERE ARE A LOT OF MATCHUPS AGAINST ARC TEAMS. FROM THE HEART AND THE KCAC. IF THEY CAN SNEAK A FEW EARLY WINS AGAINST ARC OPPONENTS, THEN THERE IS A CHANCE THEY CAN CLIMB THE ARC RANKINGS HIGH ENOUGH TO GET TWO TEAMS IN THIS YEAR. THAT WILL BE VERY IMPORTANT THIS SEASON AS THE PARITY IN THE LEAGUE WILL MAKE THAT AMC TOURNAMENT A DOG FIGHT! WITH A LOT OF PLAYERS LOST TO GRADUATION AND A LOT OF LATE COACHING CHANGES LAST SEASON, THERE ARE A LOT OF PROGRAMS IN THE AMC WHO ARE LOOKING TO TAKE THAT NEXT STEP.

THEY LOSE IST TEAM ALL-AMC MEMBER, CHIMA ODUOCHA, BUT THEY RETURN ARUGABLY THE BEST RETURNER IN THE LEAGUE IN, 2X ALL-AMERICAN AND 2020-21 AMC POY, TONY BURKS MEMBER, CHIMA CALL-MERICA, BUT THEY RETURN AROUABLY THE BEST RETURNER IN THE LEAGUE IN, 2A ALL-AMERICAN AND 202-21 AMC POT, TONY BURNS.
BURKS 16.2PPG, WAS GOOD ENOUGH FOR 3RD IN THE AMC LAST YEAR AND LEADS A GROUP OF THREE RETURNING COUGARS WHO WERE ALL AMC SELECTION
SLAST SEASON. LOOK FOR TRANSFER MARLON ALLEN (HILLSBOROUGH CC) TO HAVE AN IMEDIATE IMPACT FOR THE COUGARS AS WELL. ALLEN SPENT HIS
FRESHMAN SEASON AT TRUETT MCCONNELL WHERE HE AVERAGED 14.3PPG AND 8.9RPG. THE COUGARS LOOK READY TO WIN AN AMC TITLE!



2. Missouri Baptist

PLAYERS, BRENDON HARDY, JOHN YAEGER AND R3 PAIR, THAT TRIO WAS THEIR TOP 3 SCORERS FROM LAST SEASON. IN ORDER FOR THE SPARTANS TO REPEAT. THEY ARE GOING TO NEED A BIG YEAR FROM JADIS WHITE. IF THE TRANSFERS CAN STEP UP AND FILL IN SOME HOLES, THEN MBU WILL BE JUST FINE. THIS IS A TEAM THAT WE WILL HAVE OUR EYE ON EARLY ON IN THE SEASON.



3. Central Baptist

CENTRAL BAPTIST IS COMING OFF A BIT OF A STRANGE YEAR IN 2021-22. 
