# 2023 NATIONAL CHAMPONS

There is only one men's team in the entire country, at any level, to win 30+ games, five years in a row lexcluded covid season). The Yotes have been dominant and their youth in the program may just help sustain that success. The lotes are coming off of one of the more dominant National Title runs you will see. While the outcomes of some of the games were MUCH closer, college of Idaho was up by as much as 20 points in each and every game in the NAIA National Championships. They did let a couple teams back into games, but ultimately the Yotes looked like the team to beat since their opening night loss at Avizona Christian. They lost MVP, Charles Elzie, as he transfers to NCAA 02 Hawaii Hilb for his Senior season. We haven't seen a repeat National Champion since Oklahoma City did it in 2007 and 2008, so it's no easy task to repeat! The Yotes have the pieces inline to repeat. They will have a target on their back entering the season. However, Drew Wyman and the Yotes will be the team to beat entering into the 2023-2024 season!

WELCOME TO THE 2023-24 SFASION

225 teams begin with their eyes set on winning the 2023-24 NAIA Men's Basketball National Championship, but only 16 teams will make it to Kansas City with just on team who will be holding up the Red Banner.



he NAIA season will officially commence on October 26th, with Fisher (MA) and USCAA member, Vermont Tech, tipping off the first game at 12:01 am ET.

In total, there are 225 NAIA men's teams vying for a National Title, with 64 teams making it to the NAIA National Championships and just 16 teams making it to the final site which is held at historic Municipal Auditorium in Kansas City, Missouril

HOOPS REPORT

The Defending National Champions, College of Idaho, will once again be the team to beat this season. However, as you will see throughout this magazine, they have plenty of competition as teams loaded up for the 2023-2024 season.

The best part about the start of each season is that, for most, optimism fills the air. Sure, we know, for the most part, what teams are positioned well for league titles. However, the season still has to be played. There will be injuries. There will be upsets. There will be surprise teams who make a jump in standings. There will also be teams who won't perform as expected. There are no guarantees at this level of play.

The talent pool in the NAIA is as good as we have maybe ever seen it. There are five 1st team All-Americans back with 30 total All-Americans returning this season. We also have a ton of very productive NCAA D1 and D2 transfers coming in this season. Transfers are a pretty common thing this day and age, but I am not sure that we have ever seen this many transfers, especially from the D1 ranks, who have averaged 10 or more points per game.

With the transfer portal being as prevalent as ever, both in the aspect of NAIA to D1/D2 and D1/D2 to NAIA, it allows for coaches to build their programs in different ways. We have seen both ways be successful. You can win at this level with four-year kids, and you can win at this level with a transfer heavy roster. You can also lose at this level with both as well. The one thing that seems to be consistent with winning programs are that they are just better at what they do, then what others are at what they do. As much as people will try to tell you there is, the truth is, that there isn't any secret to success. No "one/only way" to build a successful program. If that were true, everyone would build teams the same way, play the same style of basketball and the game would probably be super boring and repetitive.

The said can be said at any level or any sport for that matter. However, for us, it is fun to see what teams look like early on in the season compared to how they finish. This season will be no different. We will see those teams who start slow and then come on strong at the end of the season as they start to figure things out. We will also see those teams who, for whatever reason, can't quite figure it out, despite being loaded on paper. The season is full of ups and downs. Those who can battle through adversity are usually the ones who find success. Who is going to win a National Title this season? We don't have those answers. This magazine simply helps to give insight on the NAIA level and to help paint the picture of the early season. Will there be teams we miss on both high and low? ABSOLUTELY! We are okay with and expect to be wrong a lot. That is what makes the season so much fun to watch! That is why the games are played! We received questionnaires this season from nearly 200 of the NAIA programs. Maybe one day we can be like the D1 Almanac and do write ups on every program. However, at this point, we are unable to do that and know that there will be players or teams we miss in our league writeups. We apologize upfront for that. We do believe though, that this is a good starting point to help to get the most information out as possible on this level and to get people to start getting excited about the seasonl

OKLAHOMA CITY HEAD COACH, COACH MARK BEROKOFF, HAS REALLY DONE A GREAT JOB OF BRINGING ATTENTION BACK TO ONE OF THE MORE TRADITION RICH PROGRAMS IN THE NAJA. NO PROGRAM IN THE NAJA HAS MORE NATIONAL TITLES (6). THE PROGRAM HAS ALSO HAO 11 GUYS PLAY IN THE NBA. A LOT OF THAT TRADITION STEMMED FROM LEGENDARY HEAD COACH AND HALL OF FAMER, A.E. "ABE" LEMONS. COACH LEMONS WAS AT OCU FOR 25 SEASONS. HE LED THE STARS TO SEVEN NCAA TOURNAMENT APPERANCES AND WON THE ALL-COLLEGE TOURNAMENT IN 1965. HE WOULD LEAVE THE PROGRAM TO COACH AT TX-PAN AMERICA AND THEN THE UNIVERSITY OF TEXAS. COACH LEMONS WOULD LATER RETURN TO OCU AND LEAD THEM TO AN UNDEFEATED REGULAR SEASON IN 1986-1987. THEY WOULD FALL IN THE NAJA TOURNAMENT TO FINISH THE SEASON 34-1. IN 1986 HE WAS THE SOONER ATHLETIC CONFERENCE COACH OF THE YEAR AND THEN IN 1981 WAS ALSO NAMED THE BASKETBALL TIMES COACH OF THE YEAR. HE WAS 427-264 IN HIS 25 YEARS AT OKLAHOMA CITY. THIS YEAR, THE ABE LEMONS CLASSIC RETURNS, NOVEMBER 2ND-4TH, AFTER MORE THAN 25 YEARS. COACH BEROKOFF AND STAFF HAVE A REALLY FUN, SEVEN TEAM FJELD COMING TO ABE LEMONS ARENA.

COACH BEROKOFF ON BRINGING BACK THE ABE LEMONS CLASSIC "I AM INCREDIBLY FIRED UP TO BRING BACK THIS CLASIC. THE NAME ABE LEMONS IS KNOWN THROUGHOUT COLLEGE BASKETBALL. OUR GOAL IS TO MAKE IT THIS THE PREMIER EVENT IN ALL OF THE NAIA!"



# HEARTOFA CHAMPION RETURN OF JACE LANCE

February 3rd, 2023 started out like any other day in Marshall, Missouri. Sophomore Point Guard, Jace Lance was attending classes while his dad, Viking Head Coach Chad Lance, was working on practice plan ahead of a big Saturday, Heart of America, showdown with league leading William Penn University. Practice was scheduled for 3pm, but Coach Lance decided that he just wanted a 45 minute shooting practice inside of Burns Gymnasium. Jace wasn't happy with that decision, and as a leader, sent a text to his coach/dad with his preference for a longer practice ahead of the game. He was overruled, in a decision that, in the end, saved his life.

The practice started off like any other. Jace, had gotten over his dads practice change and started off practice being a vocal leader. Then, without warning, Jace went quiet and stepped out of the drill. It was the very first minute of the very first drill so teammate Oliver Paulson-Gerard had some concern and was keeping an eye on Jace as the drill continued. Oliver saw Jace, rolled backwards, in what he thought was a seizure. He immediately ran down the hall to the trainers office to alert Associate Athletic Trainer, Richelle Perkins, In the meantime, Jace had awoken and was back on his feet walking towards the bleachers. Jace would collapse again. He was having Sudden Cardiac Arrest. His dad, jumped into action and began CPR. The MVC assistant coaches quickly got the rest of the team to the locker room, while assistant Romone Powell, called Jace's mom, Ellen, who has spent over 20yr as a coaches wife, knew that a call, from the assistant coach, in the middle of a practice, wasn't a good thing. Her initial thought was that something had happened to her husband, Chad. Never, as a parent, do you expect the news she was about to hear on the other end of the line.

See, at this time, Richelle, was running across the floor to the fallen player, and quickly knew the CPR, being performed by dad, to his own son, wasn't working. She ran over to grab the AED that was a few feet away. This is when Coach Powell told Ellen ""Get here NOW, they are putting the AED on Jace now!" As the words were being spoke, Richelle administered one shock and Jace came back alive!! He, understandably, was confused and asked what was going on? Shortly after, Ellen would arrive to the sight of her son still laying on the hardwood floor of Burns Gymnasium. The gym, that was right down the hall from the training room. A place they weren't even supposed to be practicing in, but a last minute change to the practice plan, by Head Coach, Chad Lance, may have just been God's way of helping a father not have to say goodbye to his son.



Ellen, being in healthcare for most of her adult life jumped into action upon arrival. As the adrenaline of those in the gym started to wear off, emotions started to set in. Ellen, asked if 9-1-1 had been called. She consoled a tearful Richelle and let her know that she did EXACTLY what she was trained to do! ""You saved his life!" Ellen assured Richelle. Ellen wouod also hear someone else sobbing in the distance. Her husband, who just went through a tramatic event with his own son.

Ellen told her husband "now is not the time. Jace doesn't know what happened and he cannot feel stress from you or I. You saw things no parent should have to see but we can't do this here and now."

For the players sake, they were brought back out of the locker room. They needed to see that "UNO" was still alive and Jace was able to let them all know that he was going to be okay. An absolute traumatic event for all involved.

With Jace alive and headed to the hospital, the next step in the process was for the family to find answers to what happened and if Jace was truly in the clear. In total, Jace would be in the hospital for the next eight days. The first night, while his dad was still in tears, Jace told his dad:

"you can cry today. But after today.... No more tears. Promise me tomorrow no more tears."

There wasn't much sleep happening, for anyone, over those days. Every day was a roller coaster. Doctors were running tests and all seemed to have different diagnosis.

one residenr, before consulting the team of physician, came in to tell Jace that he was going to have to make a big lifestyle change and thay he was done playing basketball and his heart wouldn't be able to withdtand coaching basketball either.

The ""you can't cry after today" didn't last long. The news brought Coach Lance and Ellen to tears. A few hours later a team of Cardiologists came in and told Jace that the precious information wasn't correct. They needed to run more tests before anything could be decided.

News had also spread across the NAIA ranks. coaches from all across the country sent Coach Lance and Jace their well wishes. HOF coach, Jeff Sherman, a guy who also had the honor of coaching his son, Matt, at Central Methodist (MO) and had become good friends with Chad while also watching Jace play growing up, made sure to stop in to see Jace while he was in the hospital. The messages and visits not only helped lift up Jace, but were also pivotal in helping to uplift Coach Lance's spirits as well!

The Missouri Valley team also stopped in to see "UNO". A team who went through a million emotions themselves. After a meeting, they elected to go ahead and play the next day against Park (MO). Jace wanted his dad to go to the game, but there was no way his dad was leaving his side. They were able to watch the team in the hospital room. An emotional game, that MVC would win!

Before leaving the hospital, Jace took a stressed echocardiogram. He ran 2 miles at a 16.8 incline and smashed it! He had a heart catheterization, an EP study (Electrophysiology study), cardiac MRI and finally the placement of the ICD with pacemaker. He was released to go home, but as an independent 21yr old, was suddenky very dependent on his parents again. Before he was able to return to campus living, his mother made sure he was able to take his medications on schedule. Finally, four days before Spring Break, Jace made his return back to campus. He went to watch practices and workouts every day. Finally, with a ball back in his hands, Jace knew he wanted to make it back to play. It was going to be tons of work, but as a coaches kid, he had a basketball in his hands basically since birth.

Rehabbing, conditioning, taking his meds. Jace's day-to-day routine may look different then years past, but his goals remain high. A guy who broke his foot his Senior year of high school to end his season and then saw Covid completely take away the rest of his Senior year. He is used to set-backs. He is used to being a fighter. Now he gets to fight back once again. Jace makes his return back to action on November 4th when the Vikings host Columbia (MO) at 6pm. It has been tradition for Jace to find his dad and give him a hug before he takes the floor. His dad, I am sure, will break the no crying rule again as I imagine the hug on November 4th, will come with a lot of emotions. A hug not just between a coach and his point guard, or even just between a father and son, but a hug that signifies a triumphant return by a kid with the heart of a champion!

#### A LETTER FROM JACE:

It means the world to me to be able to be back and being able to play. Of course, it has been a very up and down road throughout my process, but I can't be more excited to put that purple and orange back on this season.

This season I'm looking forward to finishing what I started. I was having a great year until it was cut short, so I want to come back right where I left off. Next, I just want to be a better teammate. I want my teammates to know that I'm here for them and we can get through anything together.

I want to say thank you to everyone who was there to save my life. You never know when things like this can happen, and I am forever in debt to them. To my dad, I love you with all I got. I can't wait to be on the floor for you and show you that I am with you to finish this out. I can never repay you for saving my life. Playing hard and devoting this year to nothing more than my health and the success of this team. That's the least I could do. To my trainer, Richelle, I owe you, my life. I know you are busy with all of us boys all the time and it's a headache sometimes, but you do an amazing job and I know the whole men's basketball team loves you for it.

Lastly, I just want to say thank you to my teammates. They have had a huge impact on my recovery. I love you guys with all I got. You guys had me on February 3 and now it's my turn to return the favor. Uno is here and has y'all's back. No Viking stands alone.





Grace Should start out the season inside the Top 5 of the NAIA rankings. The Lancers have made back-to-back trips to Kansas City and while they fell a little short of their goals last season, they are locked and loaded once again. They have arguably one of the most dominant players in the NAIA in big man, Elijah Malone. They also have two elite guars in the Gibbs twins. If they can shoot the ball from three well enough, the Lancers can certainly be holding the Red Banner at the end of the season.



It's hard to look past IWU when it comes to Crossroads League titles. Indiana Weslevan has lost some big-time players over the past two seasons, but they bring in Luke Brown, who averaged 10.2pts at D1 Stetson last season. 
